Dear Parents.

First Days at Putney High School

We realise that starting school is an exciting, but sometimes a little daunting, time for children and parents, so we are writing to give you some guidance on what your daughter needs for the first few days of school in September and an explanation of the morning routine.

During the first week, your daughter will attend school for the morning or afternoon session, as advised in the email sent to you on 9 July.

The morning session will run from 8.30-11.10am Monday-Thursday (12.30pm collection on Friday only) The afternoon session will run from 12.20-3pm Monday-Thursday (11am arrival on Friday only)

Your daughter can wear either her school summer uniform (should you have it already) or her school winter uniform. We recommend that your daughter practises taking off her cardigan/jumper before starting school, to help her feel independent, though we will, of course, help if required.

Settling-in period

Our settling-in period will run, in different forms, across the first two weeks. This is to enable the smoothest possible start to school life at Putney. During this time, the class teachers and teaching assistants will spend time getting to know each child individually, both in terms of personality and ability, as well as help her to get to know her classmates and to learn new school and classroom routines. Specialist teachers will also introduce themselves and spend time with the Reception girls in our Early Years' area. Specialist lessons will start more formally for Reception during the second week, once girls are full-time.

What your daughter needs for the first day of school on Monday 6 September (all items clearly named)

- Snack in a small snack box: one healthy snack, such as a piece of fruit, crackers or fruit bar. We are a <u>nut-free school</u> so please ensure that there is nothing that contains, or has traces of, nuts. Please also check that you daughter knows how to open and close their snack pot; we will of course help, though we would encourage independence with their personal routines.
- Water bottle which they can manage themselves (please check that they know how to open and close it). We have access to drinking water in the classroom so please supply a small water bottle which can be re-filled, if necessary.
- Book bag (purple Putney High School bag)
- Drawstring bag containing: spare underwear x 2, clean tights x2 and clean socks x1 (Please ensure all items, including socks, are named). This bag remains at school for the year.
- Long sleeved waterproof art apron with a loop, so that your daughter can hang it up easily, which will remain in school.

Putney High School

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PE for Reception girls will be on Mondays and Thursdays. For these days, girls should come to school in their PE kit and they will remain in their PE kit all day. Therefore, from week 2, girls will come to school in their uniform for three days a week and in their PE kit for two days. For week 1, they will only need to be in their PE kit on Thursday as there will be no PE for Reception on the first day of term.

What happens each session?

Week 1: Monday 6 – Thursday 9 September		
morning	Arrival	
session 8:30am afternoon	All girls will attend school for either the morning or afternoon session, as advised in the email sent to you on 9 July. Depending on government regulations for September, we hope that parents will be able to come into the school grounds and drop off their day after directly at the alexander of the school grounds.	
session	daughter directly at the classroom door.	
12.20pm	Please enter the school grounds via the grey gate on Lytton Grove – the nearest one to Tintern Close. Please wait with your daughter on 'Putney Green' (the astro area beyond the grey gates) in front of the Early Years classrooms, until we have opened our doors and welcomed the girls in.	
	Belongings to be put away With help from staff, the girls will find their peg and where their book bag goes. They will take out their snack box and water bottle and be shown where to store it. Water bottles will be placed on a shelf for them to access themselves throughout the day.	
	Coats (and cardigans, if necessary) hung on pegs On the first day, your daughter will also have her drawstring bag with her. This is to be kept in school on her peg for the year and will contain spare items of clothing and underwear which should be named.	
	Registration As soon as things are put away, the girls will sit on the carpet for Registration, in preparation for the day's activities to begin. Throughout the morning, they will have the opportunity to undertake activities both inside the classroom and in our own Early Years outdoor area.	
	Snack time Part-way through the session, the girls will all stop for snack. They will be supported to remember to wash their hands with soap before and after having their snack and to dispose of any rubbish.	
morning session 11.10am	End of Day Enter through the grey gate and wait on Putney Green in front of your daughter's classroom where we will hand over your daughter to you.	
afternoon session 3pm		

Friday 10 September – all girls to be dropped off and collected from the grey gate and to have lunch		
at school		
Morning	Arrival at 8.30am	
Group	Collection at 12.30pm: Please note the later collection time so that all girls stay for lunch	
_	and meet the other half of the class.	
Afternoon	Arrival at 11am – please note the earlier arrival so that girls can join us for lunch and	
Group	meet the other half of the class.	
	Collection at <u>3pm</u> : Please wait for your daughter in the pick-up zone. Your daughter's	
	class teacher and teaching assistant will bring the girls to the gate for dismissal.	

Week 2 onwards

All girls will attend full-time.

Arrival: Girls can arrive between <u>8.10-8.25am</u> and will come straight into the classroom. Please note that register is taken promptly at **8.25am**.

Dismissal: School finishes for Reception at **3pm**. Parents will wait on Putney Green.

Our settling-in period will continue throughout week 2 whilst the girls begin to get to know the children from the other session and learn class routines. Specialist teaching sessions will begin in week 2.

Our weekly timetable will start fully in Week 3. You will receive a copy of the timetable before then.

Dates to be confirmed at the beginning of term	Parent Volunteer Training session If you would like to volunteer to help out at school or on trips, it is advised that you attend this session, so you are aware of our school safeguarding procedures and the volunteering process.
